Andrew Brought Summarizes New California Workplace Safety Law for HR.com

Spencer Fane attorney <u>Andrew Brought</u> recently authored an article published by *HR.com* that discusses new workplace safety protocols California businesses must implement in 2024 under the state's Senate Bill 553 to protect employees from violence at the workplace.

Drew's article, <u>Workplace Violence Prevention Plans: What California Employers Need To Know</u>, explains key components of the new law which aims to increase employee safety.
